Worship in the Spirit and in Truth: Shabach: wk 4

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Memory Verse:

1 Chronicles 16:23 Sing to the LORD, all the earth; proclaim his salvation day after day.

Shabach: A Shout of Victory!

Barak: to bless and to kneel down in surrender to God.

Barak worship is to live a lifestyle of surrendering oneself to the plan and purposes of God. Everything is worship.

Tehillah: spontaneous singing of praises out of an overflow of the heart

Tehillah worship comes from the heart, from our spirit to God's spirit and springs forth from beholding who Jesus is (His authority) and what Jesus has done (on the Cross).

Proclaim Jesus every day!

Psalm 96:1-2 Sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth. Sing to the LORD, praise his name; proclaim his salvation [Jesus] day after day.

Hebrews 13:15 Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise—the fruit of lips that confess his name.

1st Mention

1 Chronicles 16:35 And say, "Save us, O God of our salvation; Gather us together, and deliver us from the Gentiles, to give thanks (Yadah) to Your holy name, to triumph (Shabach) in Your praise (Tehillah)."

Yadah: : to throw, to shoot, to cast, to lift your hands

Shabach: changes the atmosphere

1 Chronicles 16:23 Sing to the LORD, all the earth; proclaim his salvation day after day.

Jericho: walls coming down

Joshua 6:16, 20 The seventh time around, when the priests sounded the trumpet blast, Joshua commanded the people, "Shout! For the LORD has given you the city!"

When the trumpets sounded, the army shouted, and at the sound of the trumpet, when the men gave a loud shout, the wall collapsed; so everyone charged straight in, and they took the city.

Jesus: calming the storm

Mark 4:37-39 A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm.

Psalm 89:9 (NIV) You rule over the surging sea; when its waves mount up, you still them.

The Final Victory Shout

1 Thessalonians 4:16-18 For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. Therefore encourage one another with these words.

2 Thessalonians 2:8 And then the lawless one will be revealed, whom the Lord Jesus will overthrow with the breath of his mouth and destroy by the splendor of his coming.

Jesus is destroying everything that is trying to destroy us!
God has given us a shout of victory.

Shabach is a faith filled shout of victory and triumph based on Jesus and his accomplished work on our behalf.

2 Corinthians 1:20 For no matter how many promises God has made, they are "Yes" in Christ. And so through him the "Amen" is spoken by us to the glory of God.

Bonus scripture references of Shabach.

Psalm 145:4 (AMP) One generation shall praise (Shabach) Your works to another, And shall declare Your mighty and remarkable acts.

Psalm 117:1 (AMP) O praise the LORD, all you nations! Praise (Shabach) Him, all you people!

Psalm 63:3 (NKJV) Because Your lovingkindness is better than life, My lips shall praise (Shabach) You.

Psalm 147:12 (NASB) Praise (Shabach) the LORD, O Jerusalem! Praise your God, O Zion!

Life Group Discussion

1. Discuss the significance of this week's memory verse: 1 Chronicles 16:23
Sing to the LORD, all the earth; proclaim his salvation day after day.
 2. What does Shabach mean? What are the examples in the scriptures of someone using this Shout of Victory to change the atmosphere? Outcome? Results? What can we learn from these stories?
 3. Who is our faith in when we shout a shout of victory? What is the significance of 2 Corinthians 1:20 and our role in accessing victory?
 4. What will Jesus do when he returns?
 5. Discuss the power of the breath of God in us being used to proclaim loudly the promises and victory Jesus has purchased for us? Remember that the Word of God is meant to be spoken, not merely read. Read Joshua 1:8 as a reminder to speak (or shout) the Word of God.
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
