10 Things That Happened When I Was Saved, part 2

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Memory Verse:

2 Peter 1:3 His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness.

10 Things that happened when I was saved.

1. My sins are forgiven. I am made righteous forever.

Hebrews 10:10-18 ¹⁴For by one sacrifice he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy....¹⁸And where these have been forgiven, sacrifice for sin is no longer necessary.

2. My spirit is born again. I have renewed fellowship with God.

Ephesians 2:4 But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved.

John 3:5-6 Jesus answered, “Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit.

3. I am sealed with the Holy Spirit. I am in the firm and eternal grip of God.

Ephesians 1:14 When you believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God’s possession—to the praise of his glory.

4. I enter a worldwide spiritual family. I belong to the body of Christ.

1 Corinthians 12:27 Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it.

Galatians 3:26 So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith.

5. I gain access to freedom & healing from the affects of sin. I can live an abundant life.

John 10:10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.

1 Peter 2:24 He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed.

Isaiah 53:4-6 Surely he took up our infirmities (illnesses, pains, grief) and carried our sorrows (pains, suffering), yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

Matthew 8:16-17 When evening came, many who were demon-possessed were brought to him, and he drove out the spirits with a word and healed all the sick. This was to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah: “He took up our infirmities and bore our diseases.”

6. I begin a process of deliverance from the devil's lies. I can have a renewed mind.

Colossians 3:9-10 you have taken off your old self with its practices ¹⁰and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator.

2 Peter 1:4 ⁴Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature, having escaped the corruption in the world caused by evil desires.

7. I enter eternal life because death is defeated. I will be resurrected.

John 5:24 Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life.

8. I have authority over the devil and the kingdom of darkness. I can live in victory.

Luke 10:19 I have given you authority to trample on snakes and scorpions and to overcome all the power of the enemy; nothing will harm you.

9. I am a new creation in Christ. I have a new identity.

Galatians 2:20 I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live.

1 John 4:17 NASB — as He is, so also are we in this world.

10. All of Heaven celebrates with me. I am eternally loved.

Luke 15:10 In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.

Life Group Discussion 2

1. Discuss this week's memory verse:
2 Peter 1:3 His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness.
2. How are we set free from the devil's lies? Read Matthew 4:1-11. What did Jesus do to keep from falling for the devil's lies? How important is this verse to the process of being set free from the devil's lies: “You will know the truth and the truth will set you free” (John 8:32)?
3. To what extent do we have authority over the devil? In what ways is it possible to lose or surrender some of this authority to the devil? Look up Ephesians 4:26-27 as an example. What ways can we allow the devil room in our lives?
4. 1 John 4:17 concludes, “as He [Jesus] is, so also are we in this world.” What does that imply? Make a list of implications.
5. What do you think it looks like in Heaven when a lost soul returns to the Father through Jesus Christ? Who are you praying for to come home to Jesus?
